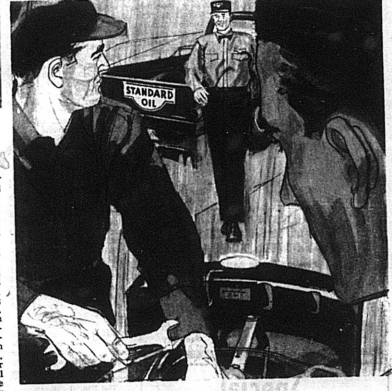
**HISTORIC RUGGLES CAMP OPENS 92nd SEASON**  
Ruggles Camp, established by the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1873, will open its 92nd encampment on Thursday, July 15, at 7:30 o'clock. The Camp Meeting will close on Sunday evening, July 25. The camp is operated by a Board of Directors recommended by the Board of Evangelism of the Kentucky Conference of the Methodist Church and elected by the Annual Conference. Dr. Robert L. Anderson is now the President of the Camp. Herchel Polley is the chairman of the Board, Rev. Robert C. Pugh is vice-chairman, John A. Stevens is the secretary and James D. Sapp is the treasurer.

Ruggles Camp in its long history has attracted some of the outstanding preachers of the nation. The rustic setting has been sought out by as many as 10,000 people on a single Sunday. Its friends are to be found in many parts of the country and interest in its development and progress has enabled the camp to make much improvement in its facilities in recent years.

The camp is located about two miles off Highway 57 between Tolleboro and Flemingsburg. Rooms are available in the dormitories and meals are served in the air-conditioned dining room by an experienced kitchen staff of cooks and dietitians. Information may be secured from John A.
