New 4-H Club Camp Opens

The North Central District 4-H Club Camp is now open, with 4-H members now using the camp. The facilities of this new camp near Carlisle in Nicholas County. See Pictures on page 5 and 9.
Anderson, Henry and Trimble county 4-H'ers were the first to use the camp; they spent over 25 July 2 there. Bourbon Clark and Harrison County boys and girls were at the camp July 2-10, and this week's 4-H campers are from Fayette and Bracken counties.
Although work remains to be done on the camp, cabins, dining hall and kitchen, shelter house and swimming pool are now usable. When completed, the camp will have some 28 buildings, 14 of which will be built for year-round use.
Four-H groups in 27 North Central Kentucky counties held fundraising drives to finance the camp, which is expected to serve some 115,000 4-H youth of the area. Many organizations, foundations and interested individuals contributed to the camp fund. In addition to the camp's use for 4-H groups, other agencies (civil, church, educational, etc.) will use the facilities for general meetings and leaders' training programs.
Four-H camping schedule for the remainder of the summer is as follows: July 15-23—Madison, Carroll and Galatin counties; July 26-30—Franklin, Scott and Henderson counties; Aug. 2-6—Mercer, Owen, Woodford, and Nicholas counties; Aug. 9-13—Jessamine, Garrard, Montgomery, and Grant counties; Aug. 16-20—Lincoln and Boyle counties.

operate the county's business. The County Attorney also pointed out to the Court that all other taxing bodies in the county should use the same type of arithmetic and in this manner each citizen's taxes should not vary a whole lot from the amount that is being paid at present.
Acting upon the recommendation of Mr. Cox, the Nicholas County Fiscal Court at their meeting unanimously approved the new assessment statement by this newspaper to all citizens of the county, stating that when the tax rate is fixed by the Nicholas County Fiscal Court in April 1965, it will be at an amount that would not seriously change the present amount of taxes paid by any person and that the amount of a tax rate would be reduced based upon the new assessment figure, which will have to be prepared in October and next April.
