From the Diary of a Country Editor

Often as we drive along country roads, we come upon an old farmhouse built "in a sink-hole," so to speak. Near at hand, more than often, appears an ideal building site, a wooded upland pasture, shaded with great oaks and ash and walnut, all that the heart of the landscape gardener might wish. And yet this house, bearing unmistakably the signs of long years of occupancy, sits "under the hill, near a stagnant pond frequently and surrounded by bare and rocky soil. One wonders at the choice of the hardy pioneer who originally settled here, unless the old spruce-trees nearby enable one to envision the original cabin reared by this sturdy woodsman. Near and often over a spring ledge, the house clings to the bottom and spring and creek long driven, the cause of it all, had been driven relentlessly back toward the setting sun.

This habit of building homes was well known to the minds of our early settlers, no doubt, when Kincaid decided his acre in the region of the village of Carlisle, also would the most beautiful building sites not be preeminent in our colored population and dedicated to those who sleep in their "hot" homes, and yet however much we may regret that the "ridge" to the north of the town is not a suburb of attractive homes, as it might be, and that the town has changed to the regret of many, it is tempered by a feeling of satisfaction in the beauty of that wooded hillside which we have held sacred for the long sleep of those whose souls have set out upon the Great Adventure. We wonder how many there are of us who are awake on the beatitudes of this really lovely spot. Under artificial light it becomes each year a more charming picture, a living lesson of the almost magic transmutation that has taken place in the formation that is the meaning of native trees and shrubs and flowers and the care of the turf may work in a hillside which would otherwise be washed, brier-angled and barren.
