**First Supervisor**

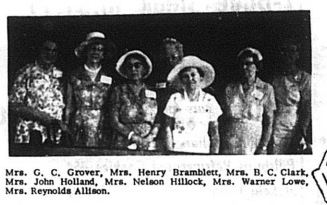
