Plant Dedication

MT. STERLING, KY. A 100,000-square-foot manufacturing plant entered the western market and most modern facility for the production of electric motors—now stands adjacent to a memorial marking the scene of a 1782 battle between U. S. Cavalrymen and the Wyandotte Indians, just outside this north central Kentucky community. With construction completed and equipment installed, the plant already is producing hermetic motors and A. O. Smith has completed preparations for three separate opening events at the new \$3.5 million facility. Employees and families attended an open house May 20. Local dignitaries and top executives representing the company's Electric Motor Division came were in attendance May 21 when Kentucky Governor Edward T. Breathitt and A. O. Smith president L. B. Smith formally dedicated the new manufacturing facility. The general public toured the plant during a May 24 open house. Situated on a landscaped 30-acre site 2 miles east of Mt. Sterling on State Highway 60, the one-story building features production equipment custom-built to meet A. O. Smith design specifications and includes a special final assembly "clean room" with closely regulated temperature and humidity controls. Six industries of Springfield, Ohio was general contractor for the new structure, designed by Philip J. Oentendor of Dayton, Ohio. The new plant is considered the largest industrial employer in the community. The commemorative



dedication, according to Max R. James, manager of the Mt. Sterling plant. A. O. Smith entered the electric motor field in the mid-1940's with the purchase of Sawyer Electric Co. of Los Angeles. In 1950, it acquired White-way Motors in Tipp City, where it erected a new plant the same year and moved the west coast operation there in 1954. Several plant expansions have been added since then, including the latest, an \$800,000 project completed in the summer of 1963 which added to existing production and research facilities. At Tipp City, about 900 per cent—an 11-1/2-inch diameter high-voltage electric motors. A. O. Smith, which has its general offices and main manufacturing operations in the United States and is active in world-wide marketing and manufacturing operations. It employs about 14,000 persons and last year had sales of \$299 million. Visitors to the open house.

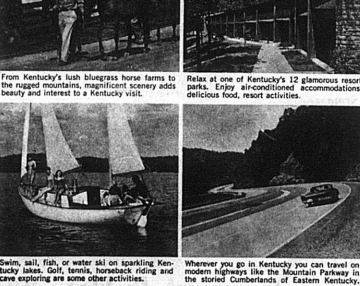
