## Farm & Home

Two feeder calf sales have been planned for this fall. They will be held at the Paris Stockyards, one will be on October 6 at 6:30 p.m. and the other on November 3 at 1:30 p.m.

There have been a few changes made in the rules and regulations. In a feeder calf sale this year, the minimum "standard" or better and weigh between 300 and 400 pounds and be less than one year of age. All cattle with horns and weighing 250 pounds are more will be sold separately from dehorned and polled cattle. Dehorned cattle will be completely healed by sale day. A special pen will be set up for cattle that have cropped (rotten) ears and tails.

It has not been definitely determined yet but they may not require the farm vaccination for leg and malignant edema, as this may be done on the day of the sale. A definite decision will be made on this later.

Technology is one of those two-dollar words you see quite often in the simplified farm, farm technology is nothing more than the use of modern methods and materials to make the farmer's work easier and more effective (and we hope, more remunerative).

Despite great technological advances, however, no one has found a way to take all the risk out of farming. And even if the crops were always good, the economics of price versus production would prevent a top farm income each year. As a result, the average farmer must save something from the good years in order to get through the lean years.

These reserves that are built up in good years must be invested in a safe security that earns a guaranteed interest. It occurs to you that some things might meet these requirements.

But one that does not is the tax deferral plan offered for accrued interest - is the Service E Savings Bond.

Why is this important? Because you will be cashing your bonds in three years of lower income and reporting the accrued interest at lower Federal income tax rates. Under most investment plans, you would have to report this interest each year as it accrued. Also, Savings Bonds are not subject to state and local income taxes.

Every try to freeze a molded gelatin product. The choice is not for water after freezing and thawing. It needs it.

Simply use one-fourth less liquid than the recipe calls for. Use one 1/2 cups water instead of the 2 cups called for. This will give you a flavored gelatin, but it will be firm.

Not only will you avoid weeping liquids, but the gelatin will set up as a crisp.

Here's a recipe for a molded chicken salad which you can put in the freezer, then bring forth when in the picnic picture.

MOLDED CHICKEN SALAD (adapted for freezing)

1 can condensed cream soup (mushroom)

1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin (one 1/4 box)

1 cup diced celery

1 pint cream in small pieces

2 cups cooked meat dressing (not mayonnaise)

1/2 cup dried meat (may substitute turkey, ham or tuna fish)

Soak gelatin in cold water and add heated condensed soup. Stir to dissolve. Add celery, then add other ingredients. Mix. Pour into a mold and chill in the refrigerator until firm. Then freeze - for no longer than 2 weeks.

Thaw overnight in the refrigerator.

## Gov. Breathitt Outlines Bond Issue Highlights

Highlights from Governor's address to the Kentucky General Assembly on Tuesday, June 7, at the State Park are as follows:

The \$176 million bond issue is not a mitigation for the Frankfort Administration. Instead, it is a milestone for Kentucky.

The occasion of the amount of the bond issue was determined solely by the identifiable needs of state agencies and institutions, tempered by the best judgment as to what was reasonable, and what we could afford. It does not, in any sense, exhaust the list of priority needs which confront our public programs and institutions.

It is probably not the maximum bond issue which the state could afford, but it is the composite judgment on both the state and the federal government, what is needed, and what we can afford.

As Governor of this Commonwealth, I recommended this bond issue to the 1964 General Assembly and I recommend it to the people of this state. This bond issue represents a carefully considered policy judgment, and there will be no change in my Administration to apologize for that judgment.

The passage of this bond issue in November will represent a renewed commitment on the part of the people to continue with progress which promises a better life and a stronger economy within our state.

The \$176 million dollars will provide for the \$86 million worth of improvements in public facilities and are the kind of facilities and improvements which mean that our people can live in safety and comfort; facilities in which the health of our people can be served; facilities in which our cultural, scientific and educational energy can be enhanced; facilities which increasingly draw thousands of vacation dollars.
