 Nicholas County's 20 best establishments had total receipts of \$216,000 in 1963. A decrease of 43 percent from 1948, according to a report of the 1963 Census of Business. The last previous census of business covered operations during 1938. The service trades include those providing personal services to individuals; miscellaneous business services; and repair and other auto services. Also included were motion picture production and distribution businesses; motion picture theaters; amusement and recreation services; and hotels and motels. The selected service trade establishment in the county employed 14 persons (exclusive of proprietors) and had a payroll for the year of \$27 thousand. The rate as a whole included 15,188 establishments with receipts of \$386.0 million.

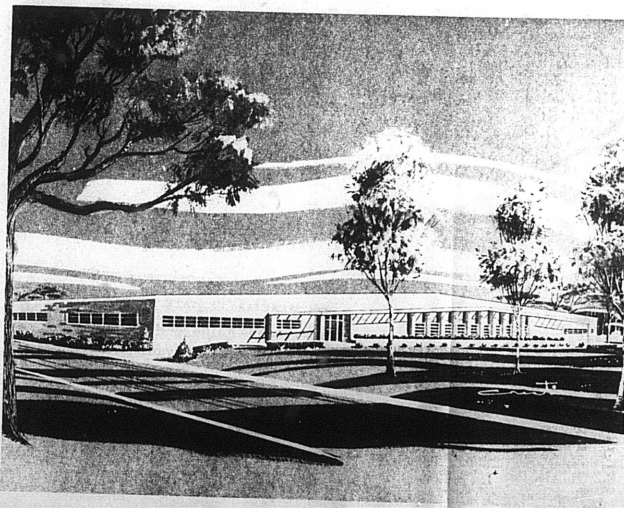

**\$1.5 MILLION FABRIC PLANT UNDERWAY**

**News Release 18 Hours Late Getting To Mercury**  
 (See Editorial Page)

Frankfort, Ky.—Ground was broken Friday at Carlisle for a \$1.5 million fabric manufacturing plant of Blue Grass Knitting, Incorporated, scheduled to begin production in January with 120 male employees. Plans for the 72,000 square-foot plant were announced jointly by Wayne Shumate, president of Blue Grass Industries, Inc., at Carlisle, and the Kentucky Department of Commerce at Frankfort. Groundbreaking ceremonies were at 10 a.m. Friday at the 52-acre site one mile west of Carlisle on Kentucky Highway 32. The plant site was purchased by the company from the Carlisle-Nicholas County Chamber of Commerce. Governor Edward T. Breathitt said in welcoming the plant "it will provide a new source of employment and economic improvement for Nicholas, Bourbon, Robertson, Bath and Fleming counties in the North Central Kentucky area." Commissioner of Commerce Katherine Peden said, "This will be an important addition to a growth area of Kentucky industry - the manufacture of apparel fabrics and clothing." Shumate said that Blue Grass Knitting will produce fabric materials for its parent firm, Blue Grass Industries, Inc., an apparel contractor for the manufacture of underwear. Plants operated by Blue Grass Industries employ 600 persons at Carlisle and 200 at Mt. Sterling. Construction of the new plant is set to get underway Monday with completion scheduled before January 1. The contract for the building has been awarded to Setzer Construction Company of Lexington.

The article was carried state-wide by the radio and the daily news media. The Mercury was unable to release the story as it came by mail from Frankfort Thursday morning, some 18 hours after the issue of June 24 was printed.
