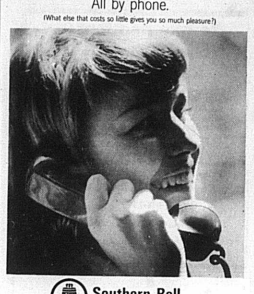

DEFENSE ASKS 451 PHYSICIANS IN SUMMER '65

The Selective Service System has received a requisition from the Department of Defense for 451 physicians to be available for active duty during the coming summer. The call is expected to be allocated after March 1, 1965.

Each service is participating in the call. In announcing the requisition, the Department of Defense said that the call is necessitated by the fact that a sufficient number of 1964 medical-school graduates did not immediately follow internship. The majority of

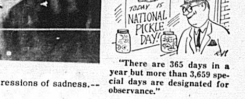
Physicians involved will serve as General Duty Medical Officers. The requirements of the services which are to be met by this call are as follows: Army 500, Navy 175, Air Force 125. The need for specialists in the Armed Forces Medical Services is filled by volunteers who have been deferred for specialty training under the Berry Plan and by physicians who are completing their military residencies. The last Selective Service call for physicians was effective in the summer of 1964. In the past, physician calls in some cases have been modified upward or downward after issuance.
