County Payroll Increases 90%

All the growth in civilian employees is not confined to the federal or state governments. The Tax Foundation reports that the number of county employees in the 6048 U.S. counties increased by 21 percent from 1967 to 1962. The figures show that in the five-year period, the most recent in which a comparison was made, county employment rose from 947,000 to 748,000 and payrolls jumped 60 percent from \$184 million to \$295 million.

The Senate-House conference agreed to a measure to the acreage-poundsage bill earlier passed by both Houses. Senator John Sherman Cooper, a member of the conference, said the House accepted all the amendments, but with some modifications. He was the author of the bill. The Senate changes in the bill will go to the White House this week after House approval. The new production control plan will be put to a referendum in the fall-cured area this year, but cannot be put into effect for hairy or dark tobacco before next year, and only after a grower referendum, Senator Cooper said in the Senate.

Senator Cooper said his amendments would: (1) assure that two-thirds of the farmers must approve acreage-poundsage; (2) protect burley growers having small allotments of one-half acre or less; (3) permit a turkey producer to market up to 10% of his poundage quota the first year and 10% in succeeding years; (4) protect grower's gain; (5) provide automatic acreage-poundsage referendum and quota prior to the referendum; (6) continue to prohibit the lease and transfer of bur-
