Fall Preparation More Popular

Preparing the plant bed in the fall for the next year's tobacco crop is rapidly becoming a standard practice in Kentucky.

There are many advantages to each work, says Mrs. Maasie U. K. Co-operative Extension Service tobacco specialist. The soil usually is just right for preparation, soil temperatures are high, moisture conditions are right, and farm work loads a little lighter.

Stems should be prepared in accordance with the type to treatment to be used, seed, level of the soil, and the amount of fertilizer to be used. The usual methods are burning, steaming, or chemical application.
