because the committee system is the backbone of farm programs — those dealing with conservation of soil and water, as well as the price support activities for various commodities, in the last few years the farmer-elected committee system — unique in the history of agriculture — has been studied by the committee of farm and public administration especially appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture. The system not only has been retained, but has been greatly enlarged. A farmer eligible to take part in one or more of the national farm programs which the ASC committee helps to administer. A person eligible to hold office as a committee member is a resident who is eligible to vote in the election and who meets the qualifications.
