Nicholas Soil Conservation District Report Released

INTRODUCTION
The Nicholas Soil Conservation District, a sub-division of State government, has rendered 22 years of uninterrupted service to farmers of the county.

The never-ending struggle to conserve soil, water and natural resources has been combated by the formulation and execution of realistic conservation programs.

Effective conservation programs have been implemented with the cooperation of USDA Soil Conservation Service personnel, representatives of the county and community Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, and other agriculture representatives.

Two supervisors, Mr. Henry and Mr. Auxier, have served since the District was organized on April 10, 1943 and they completed 22 years. Mr. Whaley has served 21 years. Mr. Hollar has served a dozen years and Mr. Stile has been on the Board about a decade.

ACTIVITIES
The first Wednesday night of each month finds the supervisors in regular session. As necessary, special meetings are called. The absence of a supervisor is rare, indeed. Two supervisors, Mr. Henry and Mr. Whaley, have missed only one or two meetings during the more than 20 years they have served.

Supervisors were supplied reference material and inserts for use in promoting Soil Stewardship Week. We sponsored a Soil Conservation Essay Contest. We contributed cash prizes to students writing the best essays. Fall and FFA Soil Judging Contests were sponsored.

Photographic supplies are furnished in the promotion of Soil and Water Conservation.

Supplemental engineering survey equipment and supplies are furnished SCS personnel for use in getting contour lines on the land. This included a 25 foot fiber glass survey rod costing a little more than \$50.

District representatives are sent to Area and State meetings.

A loan from the Division of Soil and Water Resources' Revolving Fund enabled the District to sponsor the purchase of a bulldozer by Fred Himes. The acquisition of a new bulldozer contributed to the up-grading of equipment in the county to do conservation work. More than \$100,000 have been borrowed during the past 20 years. All of this has been repaid or is being repaid on schedule.

With the Robertson Soil Conservation District, we co-sponsored our second joint cooperative meeting and fish-fry in August at Blue Lick State Park. We presented "Master Conservationist" Awards to Fred Whaley and Walter W. Kendall. An "Honor Award" was presented to Norman Killip for his efforts in promoting Soil Stewardship Week. Dr. Harry Sparks, Superintendent of Public Instruction for the State of Kentucky, was guest speaker.

Ministers were supplied reference material and inserts for use in promoting Soil Stewardship Week. We sponsored a Soil Conservation Essay Contest. We contributed cash prizes to students writing the best essays. Fall and FFA Soil Judging Contests were sponsored.

Photographic supplies are furnished in the promotion of Soil and Water Conservation.

Supplemental engineering survey equipment and supplies are furnished SCS personnel for use in getting contour lines on the land. This included a 25 foot fiber glass survey rod costing a little more than \$50.

Cash was contributed for prizes in the County Youth Fair and the local horse show.

Our part-time secretary, Doris Whaley, does our clerical work and assists SCS personnel in their increasing administrative work by equipment.

Funds needed in conducting our many activities are obtained from the Fiscal Court, Grant and Matching Funds from the State of Kentucky, voluntary contributions by equipment and farmers and from tank farm rentals.

Conservation in the District
Thirty new cooperators, owning 3,466 acres, signed cooperative agreements with the District and requested help with their conservation problems. More than 100 cooperators were given on-farm assistance. Complete soil and water conservation plans were completed on 23 farms. Almost 1,800 acres of cover crops were seeded on contour land.

Almost a mile of diversion channels were built. Eighteen farm ponds were constructed, 33 acres of sod-water were in the planning and application of conservation work. SCS personnel work in this and Robertson County.

The Extension Service with its County Agent and Home Demonstration Agent has furthered the cause of conservation with their educational programs and cooperative tours and demonstrations.

The Agricultural Conservation Program provides for much needed financial assistance to farmers under the cost-sharing provisions of the program.

The Vocational Agricultural Department of the consolidated high school promotes soil and water conservation through its teaching. School officials and teachers cooperate in promoting the Soil Conservation Essay Contest. Approximately 400 essays were written by students last year. Financial assistance to cooperators was provided by the Farmers' Home Administration and other lenders.

The promotion of fish and wildlife is conserved by Harry Dunlop, Conservation Officer and his Junior Conservation Clubs.

The Carlisle Mercury, a local weekly publication, devotes valuable space to news articles and pictures depicting soil and water conservation. As a means of informing the people and promoting the adoption of conservation measures, their service is indispensable.

Chairmen supported Soil Stewardship Week by delivering sermons and conducting radio programs.
