Look For Good Design In Antiques

When you shop for antiques, remember that age isn't the only point to check. Good design also is important. If an antique is to add beauty to your home, says Kathryn SeBree, UK Extension specialist in home furnishings...

Some experts say a piece should be at least 100 years old before it can be classed as antique. Articles that are only fairly old are sometimes sold as valuable antiques. Other antique-hunters may buy a very poorly-designed item just because it's more than 100 years old. The fairly old piece, if well-designed, might make an attractive addition to your home, even though it isn't valuable; but the poorly-designed article, regardless of its age, probably will detract from rather than add to your decor.

Follow the same guide rules for good design when choosing antiques that you'd use in selecting the best antiques. Remember that articles of good design are ageless; but the fact that an article is old doesn't guarantee good design.

Look for simple lines that are related to the overall shape of the object. The lines should add to the usefulness and attractiveness of the article and carry the eye to another. The different parts of the object should be in proportion to each other and to the whole. For example, you might see furniture with legs that are too tall in proportion to the entire piece.

An antique should serve a useful purpose, too. And be sure, when you buy antique furniture, that it is strong, not weak and wobbly.

Fake antiques are poor design on antiques just as they are on modern furniture. Miss SeBree points out. And over-decoration spoils the structural design of an antique just as it does a modern piece.
