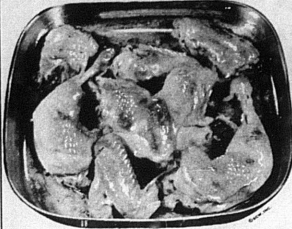

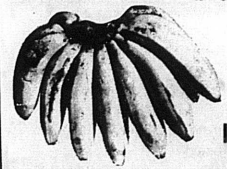

V.A. Questions
Q--I have heard of a bill in Congress that will enable all ex-GI's to obtain a GI loan for a home, etc. My husband was in the service from 1958 to 1961. Would he be eligible for this benefit from the VA and what limitations are made by this bill?
A--The bill to which you refer has been passed and is now law. If a veteran has had 90 days of consecutive active duty and an honorable discharge, he may qualify for a loan for a home. This loan is administered by the Federal Housing Administration; the veteran must obtain a certificate of veteran's status from the VA. If a veteran has

already had a GI loan, he does not qualify under this new loan program.

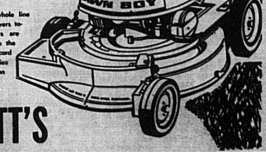
