Boat Registration Deadline Sunday

Frankfort—May 1 is the deadline for registering mechanically-propelled motorboats with the State.

William K. King, Director of the Kentucky Public Safety Department's boating division, said owners of all such boats should register with their local circuit court clerk who will issue temporary windshield decals. The decals will serve as proof of registration until certificates of number cards are mailed from the division of boating.

Registration costs range from \$3.50 to \$10.50, depending on the size of the boat, King said. He added that law enforcement officers from his office would check closely for unregistered boats after the May 1 deadline.

King noted that registrations through April 1 are running 2,200 ahead of the same time last year. In 1965, 35,800 boats were registered in Kentucky.
