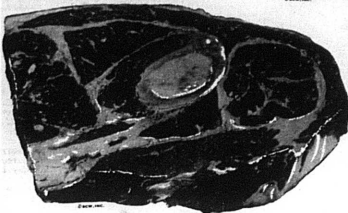

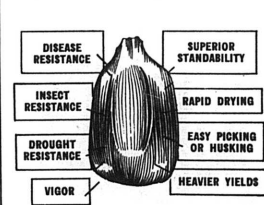

After then the American forces in Vietnam." Sen. Cooper declared, "Now we have a situation where the United States must reach new decisions, if South Vietnam cannot settle its internal problems."
The New York Times, in its story about growing concern in the Senate, described Senator Cooper as one "whose views command respect on both sides of the aisle." It said his speech left support for the war declining in the Senate, Chairman of the Armed Services Committee, who has also consistently supported requests by President Johnson for funds to support our military forces in Vietnam. Russell had said in Georgia that "it becomes clearly evident that a majority of

the Vietnamese do not want our help. I would favor withdrawing immediately both military and economic aid."

Throughout the county, wet weather veins outcrop and make muddy areas in tobacco fields. This excess water may be intercepted and conducted underground to open streams.
Clyde Stanton installed a similar drainage system this year. Walter Hollar plans to do likewise. Several years ago, Paul Day and Howard Livingood, neighbors to Jenkins, installed several hundred feet of tile. This type of conservation work, requiring accuracy in installation, is designed by the Soil Conservation Service and is eligible for cost-sharing under the provisions of the Agricultural Conservation Program.

Sen. Cooper Calls For 'New Decisions' On Vietnam Unrest

During the political crisis in South Vietnam last week, including the confrontation of the Buddhists and the military regime of General Ky, Senator John Sherman Cooper spoke in the United States Senate of his deep concern.
"It may be, as some in the Administration have said, that the struggle between factions in South Vietnam is a healthy sign representative of the desire of the people to secure a more representative and democratic government," Cooper said. "But these serious military and political problems for the United States. If they are not resolved, the struggle will withdraw South Vietnamese from the battle, and will obstruct and endanger the efforts of the United States forces."
"The attack on the air base at Saigon—which I have visited twice in the last four months, and which is susceptible to other attacks—may well be the forerunner of continuing attacks on Saigon. The United States forces will protect themselves," Senator Cooper pointed out. "But it is difficult to see how they can prosecute the war under such circumstances."
"It is an obvious political fact that the people of South Vietnam are not willing to defend their country, the United States cannot do for them," Cooper said.
"Our country has acted honorably in Vietnam for several years. It has kept its promises and commitments. No men have ever fought more bravely and with greater sacrifice
