The following article which is reproduced from a bulletin written by the director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, is, in our opinion, worthy of your careful reading.

ITS DAY-TODAY OPERATIONS, law enforcement deals primarily with one of the most elemental concepts of mankind—the difference between right and wrong. Over the years the citizens of this country, through their representatives in Congress and State legislatures, have written the Nation's concept of this difference into our laws and statutes.

Unfortunately, the concept of right and wrong is not as clear and strong in the hearts and minds of present-day Americans as it was in the hearts and minds of our forefathers. Acts that are ignored by youth of our society. Assurance of quality is one of the major contributions of advertising to the consumer. The retailer, the service firm, the manufacturer who spends thousands—or millions—of dollars to build a reputation cannot afford to jeopardize his business by failure to deliver the quality offered in advertisements.

The local newspaper derives its right to accept payment for advertising by placing reliable news or reliable advertising. As in other medium, the advertiser in the local newspaper can be called to account for misleading advertising. Over a longer period of time they learn the same about the performance of an entire store. They know that good phone bills are not advertising removed from retail shopping. The local publisher is the neighborly dealer in the local market. It is the local community.
