Boundaries Set For ASC Elections

Harvey Wagoner, Chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Committee, today designated the boundaries of the county's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee.

The Chairman reminded farmers that the county's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee and two alternates for each community. The chairman, vice chairman, and third regular member of the elected ASC committee will be held on Monday, August 14, at 6:30 p.m. at the county convention to be held soon thereafter, where farmers will vote to elect the county committee. The alternate committees will be elected at the convention.

Farmers eligible to cast ballots in the election will be all those who are eligible to participate in one or more of the national farm programs which are administered by the county. The farmer may be an owner, tenant, or sharecropper. He must be a resident of the county and have a legal voting age who are in charge of the farming operation on an entire farm or be eligible to vote in the election. Eligibility to vote—or to hold office as a committee member—is not restricted by race or color.

In addition, the Department of Agriculture, through ASCS, supported prices of such commodities as dairy products, tobacco, peanuts, etc., through purchase or other operations authorized by local farmer-committees.
