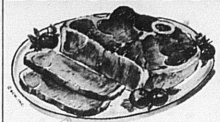
Services were conducted at 2 p.m. Saturday at Fonia Funeral Chapel by the Rev. James Soran-

**FISHING IS GOOD—ANYTIME**—In Kentucky the fishing season is always open, and Joe Polston, Jamestown, who took this string of mixed bass from Lake Cumberland during November will testify to the quality of winter-time catches. The State Parks Department says good catches are made at all Kentucky reservoirs during the late fall and winter months. All state park boat docks remain open year-round to accommodate travelers.

**Winter Parks** limited and warm-weather attractions are shut-down for winter. During late fall and winter, pleasant mild days, especially on weekends, attract a large number of persons to the State's 34 parks and shrines, he reported. He said many persons bring a picnic lunch as picnic areas are always open. Some "hardy souls," he said, actually prefer to accommodate themselves to the winter weather.

Lexington—Use care in stripping tobacco crops this year, says Frank Massey, U.K. Cooperative Extension Service agronomy tobacco specialist. "The crop was harvested later than normal this year, some places as much as four weeks later," he says. "Many crops still are turning out. We have seen a good many 'fat stems' in barns this season. This tobacco should not be stripped out until the stems are dry and the crop is ready for such stripping." Deliveries to market will start in mid-November, he noted, which means Kentucky farmers have plenty of time to strip their crops and sell them this season. "The market will be open on January 1967 and it is expected to be good that month." Don't hurry to strip a crop not ready for it just because market delivery dates or selling dates are early, he urges. "Much of the present crop will finishing up in the curing process."
