

### Bufs Defeat Blue Jackets

The Georgetown Buffaloes defeated the Nicholas County Blue Jackets Friday night 61 to 42. In a closely contested ball game for two quarters in which the Jackets held their own, the Buffaloes being much stronger on the boards pulled away in the last quarter for an important C.K.C. win. In a game in which both teams unable to hit well develop into a low scoring first half which Georgetown held a slim 24 to 20 lead. In the final quarter Georgetown found the range hitting on 50% of their shots and went on to post the season against only three setbacks. The Blue Jackets record now stands 7 and 5 for the season. In most counties, tentative full values already have been made on all real estate.

Lickett emphasized that the procedures being used by the county tax commissioners are based on one of the most widely accepted property appraisal principles—the use of comparable sales. Under this method, the tax commissioner compares properties which have not sold with like properties which have sold recently. If properties are different, allowances are made for the differences. The Commissioner further stated that this method is useful to individual property owners in arriving at the fair cash value of their property. He suggested that property owners who have owned their property for many years and are unsure of its present value might compare it with similar properties that have sold in recent years.
