Set regulator at 550° F. or broil. Place steak on the broiler rack, adjust or set unit so steak is about 2" from heat. (Place thick steak further in, use lower door open. Broil on one side until nicely browned, turn and broil on other side. (Use tongs or spatula to turn.)

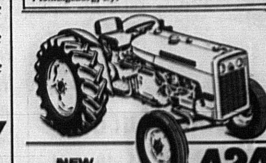
