Frankfort, Ky.—The interest rate of 4.81 per cent of the \$120,000 of Kentucky Tollroad bonds sold last week may be used as an index of the future business prospects of Kentucky.
This is a "most favorable" rate Gov. Edward T. Breathitt said in light of the tight conditions of the money market today. The rate is lower than bonds on the Eastern and Western Parkway, and slightly higher than the Bluegrass Parkway.
Business leaders may read into this bright hope for further industrial expansion prospects for more new industry coming into the state.
The bond issue will build three projects, the 51 mile Jackson Purchase Parkway linking Fulton on the Tennessee border to Mayfield, Benton and Calvert City, the 70.7 mile Pennyrite Parkway linking Hopkinsville, Madisonville and Henderson, and a 10.5 mile extension of the Western Kentucky Parkway to near Kuttawa to the state proposed Interstate 24.
This will give Western Kentucky a tie-in to four-lane limited access roads crossing the state east and west, and north and south. The Purchase Parkway will tie into I-24 at Calvert City.
Highway Commissioner Henry Ward expects these to be completed by some time in 1968. This will

make a total of 357 miles of toll road in Kentucky, not counting the Kentucky Turnpike from Louisville to Elizabethtown because this is considered a portion of the Interstate system.
The Eastern Kentucky Parkway is 76 miles, Western Parkway 127 miles, and the Blue Grass Parkway 72 miles.
The Mountain Parkway (Eastern) bonds sold at the highest rate of 4.86 per cent average while the Western averaged 4.93 and the Blue Grass 4.12. Added to this network of limited access roads will be the 435 miles of truckline highways in Eastern Kentucky under the Appalachian Program of the Federal Government where the state pays 30 per cent of cost and the federal 70 per cent.
The low interest rate on the \$120,000 indicates confidence of investors in the light of today's market in Kentucky's future development.
Finance Commissioner Felix Joyner said this sale was a better bargain than any of the other four Turnpike Authority bond issues in the light of the national index of bond interest costs.
When these roads are linked with the Ohio River as transportation arteries, Kentucky sits in one of the most favorable positions in the country in comparison with other states. With the national trend of industries spreading their plants across the country from the concentrated east and Great Lakes area, Kentucky's position is bright, state officials believe. Kentucky is about one-day's drive from a third of the population of the United States.
The road system also enhances the business potential of Kentucky's Parks as vacation centers for this concentrated population. The new parkways in the Western part of the state will tie in with the TVA between the -Lakes development for vacationers. The tourist business is considered here as second only to agriculture in the state's economic picture. Of course, industry as a whole exceeds either
