Verailles High football field. Viewers will have an opportunity during the afternoon to see the cars and drivers in action. Entertainment will include a cranking contest, an obstacle course for the cars, a burn blowing contest, and one of yesterday's well-known skits, "The Independent Hobo." Also, the Versailles High band will perform. The rally promises to be a unique history lesson for young people. White believes, "because Kentucky does not have an antique car museum and most youngsters can only read about the automobiles which historically have made a significant contribution to America's development."

I am not interested, I assure you, in chiding you for the record a long list of arrests and convictions, but I do think that the book should be thrown at the drunk or drinking driver, who menaces the lives of others on our highways, as well as the fellow who drives when unlicensed or under suspension.

Records show that more than 85 per cent of the drivers on our highways are sober, careful drivers who obey traffic regulations. What I see is a lot of people who fail to take to the road when drivers in the bad category are made realize Kentucky means business, when the speeding, reckless, drinking driver is imprisoned with the fact that our traffic laws are going to be enforced, and that conviction of violation will result in punishment, then he will fall in line.

Notices that my campaign to promote highway safety had been broadened and intensified were included in a letter to several days ago to county judges, attorney and court clerks of the first four classes.

I told them that I had directed the State Police to conduct an all-out crackdown through an extended period until aluminum foil could be reduced, and I urged local officials to join me in this campaign, using all the resources at their command to make it succeed.

Support of the citizenry of Kentucky on a statewide basis is an absolute requirement of any drive to reduce traffic deaths and injuries. Our traffic courts and judges, as well as our prosecuting county and state attorneys only reflect the will of the people.

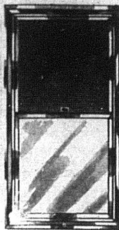
Good, safe and careful driving must be made fashionable in Kentucky. Drivers of all ages must look on it as "in" and look on reckless, careless driving as "out". They must be ready themselves to pay the penalty for conviction of a violation, and must insist that others do likewise.

VA Questions

Q—Will VA guarantee a business loan under the new GI Bill?
A—No. Business loans are not authorized. GI loans may be made for the purchase of homes, farm supplies or equipment, or to obtain farm working capital, also to make alterations, repairs or improvements in homes already owned and occupied, or to refinance delinquent indebtedness on the property.

Q—Can the so-called six-month enlistment advantage of the new GI Bill?
A—No. Six month enlistment, national guard re-enlistment and those who go

on active duty for training purposes only are not eligible for the benefits of the new GI Bill.

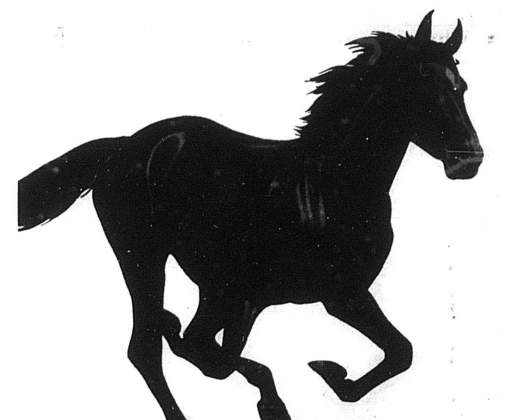
