Burley Crop Measurement Progressing In County
Measurement of the 1966 crop of burley tobacco is now in progress. Reports have been given training at the ASGS Office by the County Supervisor, Clay Man, and a representative from the State ASGS Office.
To save the tobacco program which is on the verge of being lost, emphasis is being placed on a better job of measuring. Farmers sometimes fail to carry and place the measuring pins correctly and honestly, resulting in incorrect acreages. This year all farmers are requested to carry the chain and one pin in the same hand, thus getting a more accurate measurement. Co-operate with the reporter when he comes to your farm and bacco program which is the cash crop for Nicholas County. A lot of hard work and expense goes into the field. This not only takes time but it is easy to make a mistake in computations which results in dissatisfaction. The reporters have been instructed not to figure in the field, don't ask them to do something which is against the policy of measuring.
If a producer is in excess of the farm allotment, he will receive an excess notice, then he must come into the county office and make a request and a deposit to dispose of the excess tobacco. This request must be made within 15 days from the date of the notice.
"Let's get a good job done. Let's save our burley tobacco crop," Harvey Waggoner, ASGS chairman, admonishes. All farmers participating in the feed grants will have the feed grants and wheat acreage measured at the time the burley tobacco is measured.
