## Highway System Wonder of World

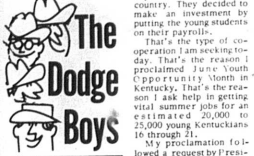

The road pavement, if made into one huge parking lot, could accommodate two-thirds of all the motor vehicles in the United States.

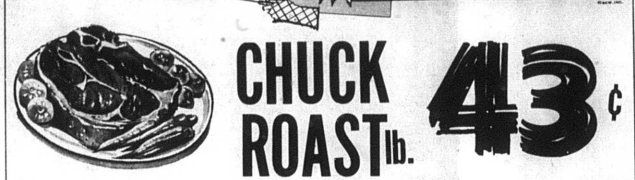

Pizzullo, a vice-president of a retail store, recently told the annual conference of the Advertising Women of New York. ## Good Health, Good Looks, Good Milk

Milk is a bargain in nutrition. It's getting over 100 different nutrients—minerals, vitamins, sugars, protein elements, etc.—needed for good health.
