Points on selecting plants for our landscape were very interesting given by Mrs. Hloraz Bell on Thursday at Parka Homemakers Club at the home of Mrs. Sherman Hollar.

It is very important to consider size of plant in relation to space available for it when choosing one for your yard. The shape of plants is also so important as it changes during the life time of plant. For instance a pin oak is cone shaped when young but later when matured it is broad topped. The front door of our homes should be the focal point in our landscaping. Broadly or sharply pyramidal plants can be used to accent one side of front door of an informally balanced home and roundish plants such as round leaf holly and Japanese hollies on other side to balance vertical line.

For formally balanced homes, low roundish plants of equal size are used on both sides of the door. The lessons on braiding rugs have been very challenging to members of our club who had never done it before and those who had braided many rugs admitted they gained many helpful suggestions for future use.
