March 31 Medicare Deadline

Lexington, Ky.—March 31, 1966 is an important date for senior citizens, says Stephen Q. Allen, UK Extension specialist in agricultural economics. That's the deadline sign-up date for the hospital and medical insurance recently added to the Social Security program.

If you're 65 years of age or older, you're probably eligible for this insurance, usually called Medicare, even if you have never worked under Social Security. However, you must sign up by the end of March in order to be covered by Medicare insurance when it goes into effect July 1, 1966. Allen points out, you fall to sign up now, you won't have another chance to become insured under Medicare for almost two years.
