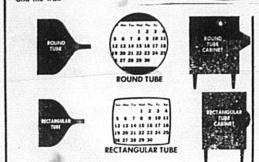

Four rate reductions in three years

At the better under the Kentucky Department of Law's new warning of "let the seller beware."

Attorney General Robert Matthews says the response has been gratifying since he announced in January that his department was establishing a Division of Consumer Protection to guard citizens against "unethical and fraudulent sales practices."

Matthews also noted that complaints involving interstate commerce or use of the mails to defraud, necessarily will be referred to the proper Federal authorities.

"The aim of the new division," Matthews says, "is to drive the 'cheat' out of business... We cannot replace personal attorneys in every day business affairs, but in those instances where a person feels he has been victimized by a fraudulent operator, or where he knows of fraudulent advertising or activities, we urge him to report it promptly to our office."

The Division of Consumer Protection has listed a number of "don'ts" for the guidance of buyers, such as "don't permit a household appliance television set or radio to be taken by a repairman without first receiving a written estimate of probable repair cost."

"Don't sign a contract without reading it carefully and fully... especially the fine print," the division advises, and "never sign a blank contract, or a contract with blank spaces in it."

Some other warnings are "don't be duped into accepting a written merchandise sent to you through the mail... don't hesitate to investigate before buying... don't allow door-to-door salesmen to leave merchandise with you on an 'approval receipt' until he returns."

Above all, the department recommends, "don't stop with the comment 'I'll know better next time' when you have been duped on a purchase. Do something about it. Notify the Consumer Protection Division, Attorney General's Office, Frankfort, Kentucky."

Matthews believes "the vast majority of Kentucky businesses deal fairly and honestly, but they do suffer from the business 'cheat.'" He said that in helping the consumer "we also render a service to the legitimate business community."

### How Much Do You Know

about nuclear fallout, radioactivity, radiation,....? Just what would you do in case there was a nuclear war? Where would you go? What would happen to our livestock, our crops, our food supply, to us and our families?

All is not lost. There are some things that each of us should know in case of a nuclear attack. There is also the beneficial use of atomic energy to benefit mankind—producing electricity, medical research and treatment, agricultural experimentation and research and thousands of other uses presently being employed and a multiplicity of uses not yet discovered.

Approximately 300 Nicholas County boys and girls have had a most interesting experience during the past few weeks studying the effects of radiation on seed. In the above photo Miss Fleet Allison, with three other Carlisle 8th Grade students—Paul Purcell, Sally Lipscombe and Diana Link, are shown setting up a display at the Nicholas County ASCS Office on East Main Street in Carlisle to show the results of their experiment.

This 4th project was developed by the University of Kentucky Agricultural Engineering Extension staff and has been available in all counties in Kentucky.

Each student was given a corn and okra seed were exposed to several levels of radiation and each member then planted the seed to study and record the effects that the radiation had on the seed.

This project has helped to bring home to each student the fact that we are living in a Nuclear Age and that all of us need to be sincerely concerned and to become more aware of the things we should know. Want to know more? Just ask any elementary or junior high student in Nicholas County. Chances are you'll receive some very helpful and practical information.

The following summary of the experiment by Miss Allison briefly describes her room's work with the project. Grade 8-1 Science Class in the Carlisle School recently completed a unit on Civil Defense. ### Black Plastic Mulch Best For Vegetable Plot

Black plastic, used as a mulch on vegetable plots at the University of Kentucky Ag experiment Station, apparently is the best type plastic mulch for several reasons.

So says Dr. F. E. Knavel, vegetable researcher. He quoted results from five years testing clear plastic against black plastic plots where no

weed growth was a problem when clear plastics were used throughout the entire growing season, when some test plots were treated against weeds, the black plastic still was superior to the clear.

Yields were reduced significantly, too, he noted, when clear plastic plots were extended growing season.

There were no appreciable differences in yields due to different thicknesses or different widths of either clear or black plastic used.
