**Brigadier General Jack H. Owen of Cynthiana**, a command pilot with 4,600 hours of flying time last Wednesday assumed command of the 12th Tactical Reconnaissance Wing, Kentucky Air National Guard, based at Standiford Field in Louisville.

Owen, 46, was appointed by State Adjutant General Arthur V. Lloyd to succeed Brigadier General William H. Webster a Louisville banker who retired from the Air National Guard after 25 years of military service.

The president of a Cynthiana tobacco warehouse to civilian life, General Owen's military career began in 1940 when he enlisted as a private in the Army Reserve.

After getting his pilot's wings and a commission, he was sent to Europe as a bomber pilot. On his ninth combat mission, he was shot down over Hamburg, Germany in July 1945, and was a prisoner-of-war for 21 months.

Owen joined the Kentucky Air National Guard in 1948 and was recalled to active duty with the unit for 28 months during the Korean War.

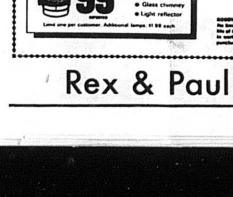
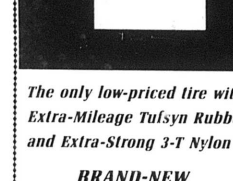
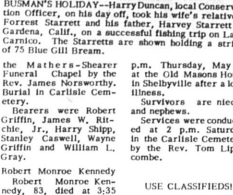

Less than 10 months ago, Woodrow T. (Woody) Fryman was a tobacco farmer, little known outside the vicinity of his native Flemingsburg, Ky.

Today, he's a full-fledged major-league pitcher.

Fryman, a Pittsburgh pirate left-hander with less than three months experience in organized baseball, turned back the world champion Los Angeles Dodgers 4-3 in Pittsburgh Friday night in his first major-league start.

Pitching the full nine innings he held the Dodgers to seven hits, struck out four and walked only one. Only two of his three runs were earned.

In addition, Fryman cracked out his first big-league hit, a second-inning single that drove in one of the Pirates' runs.

The gritty performance by the 23-year-old pitcher capped a Cinderella-like story that began just last June.
