FRANKFORT, Ky. — While the chief of occupation of the Democrats here seems to center on speculation of who will be the administration's primary, Republicans are busily themselves trying to win at least three of the congressional seats this year.

Republicans also have their eye on keeping Senator John Sherman Cooper in good position, but they have little fear that he will get little opposition from the Democrats in November. There is certainly little interest in May primaries for the senatorial. Cooper to outdistance Democratic opposition for the fifth congressional seat again this fall, but they have their eyes focused now on the new third and fourth district seats.

Former Louisville Mayor William O. Cowger has opposition in the Republican primary for the third district spot on the Republican ticket in

Louisville but observers expect him to win the nomination with ease.

Incumbent Democrat Charles Farnsley is not seeking re-election, and this is an indication to Republicans that their chances are extra bright for winning this seat in November.

Republicans are in control of City Hall and the Courthouse in Jefferson for the second consecutive term, and the Fourth Street Democratic organization has been disrupted with the resignation of Mrs. Louise McLaughlin. The Democrats have lost the patronage of the Hall and Courthouse for the past five years, and their finances are at the lowest ebb in years.

However, State Representative Norman Blume is making a spirited fight for the nomination to oppose Cowger in November.

The new fourth district, changed by the last session of the General Assembly, is considered a swing situation that includes the Republican area of Jefferson County outside of Louisville, a string of small counties on the Ohio River and populous Kenton and Campbell Counties across from Cincinnati.

Republicans have great hopes they can win this seat in November that has been held by Democrat Frank Clark who retired when his home county Natchers' second district in the re-appointment.

Snyder's chief opposition for the Republican nomination is James Thompson, an attorney who holds a more liberal view. Thompson has the support of Jefferson County Judge Marjorie Cook and his organization.

Cook is mentioned as the chief contender because of his late victory in Jefferson County last time plus his good image as a campaigner. However, Louis H. Nunn, the Republican candidate who lost to Farnsley in 1963 by a margin of 13,000 is also prominently mentioned. Cook disclaims any desire to run, but there are powerful Republican forces pushing him. Former Congressman Eugene Siler is also prominently mentioned by administration Democrats, but there are no signs yet of his making a bid.
