The Nicholas County "Blue Jackets" has captured its second district baseball championship in the history of the school. It was back in 1955 that Nicholas County won the championship — and Tuesday afternoon the Blue Jackets copied their second — winning the 37th District Baseball Tournament by blanking Harrison County 4 to 0. Nicholas County the Cinderella team gained the finale by defeating Bourbon County 7 to 5 and then blanking M.M.I. 11 to 3. Harrison County gained the finale by dumping the Paris Greyhounds 8 to 7. The Blue Jackets piled up all their runs in the third inning. John Hamilton hit a triple to drive in two big runs after two singles had put batmen on first and second. Gayle Snapp and Conn Abhee hit back to back triples to score the other two runs.

Curve balling Bobby Lynn was the winning pitcher allowing Harrison County hit four singles, while the Blue Jackets collected 10 hits off Harrison County pitchers Fuller and Reynard who came in the third. Bill Hamilton and Gary Crawford, two freshman players, each had a pair of singles for the Blue Jackets.

The Blue Jackets coached by Don Hurton were runner-up in the district play two years ago. Nicholas County advances to the Regional Tournament this week in Lexington. All games will be played in the University of Kentucky Sports Center.
