**USDA Announces Tobacco Grade Loan Rates**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture today announced grade loan rates for the 1966 crop burley, fire-cured, dark air-cured, and Virginia sun-cured tobacco.

Based on an average loan level of 60¢ cents per pound for the 1966 crop, the grad loan rates for burley tobacco range from 24 to 26 cents per pound. These rates are 1 or 2 cents higher for each grade than for the 1965 crop.

Average price support loan levels for these tobaccos announced are: 1966, respectively, an increase of about 7 percent over the 1965 levels. Grade loan rates for Kentucky's 1966 crop: fire-cured, type #2 and #3, \$1.29 and \$1.25, respectively; dark air-cured, type #1, \$1.29; Virginia sun-cured, type #1, \$1.29.

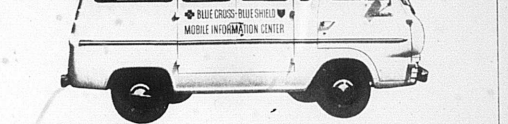
**Take Precautions Now To Control Black Shank In 1967 Burley Crop**

Black shank was more of a problem in 1966 tobacco crops than for several years. Take precautions now to prevent it in 1967, says H. H. Smiley, U.S. Cooperative Extension Service agronomy department tobacco specialist.

Some tips for the next crop, if a farmer had black shank in the 1966 crop: 1. Clean all tools and equipment used on the infested ground first. 2. Let the infested ground rest three years or more. This generally will clear up black shank organisms. 3. Don't spread sweepings and stubs from infested land on clean land. If these crop residues must be disposed of on the farm, put them on the land from which the infested crop came. 4. Do not let the land rest for tobacco three years or longer. 5. Don't put sweepings or stubs on land where surface water will drain into a creek or stream. This spreads the organisms. 6. Stack shank fungus lives longer on heavily tilled land. 7. River flow land becomes more quickly free of shank. 8. If it can not be infected from tobacco stubble, it may be safer for rotation than higher land. 9. Never use stable manure on tobacco land. If the farm has had black shank fields can be infected this way. Also, livestock and equipment can carry the fungus to clean land.
