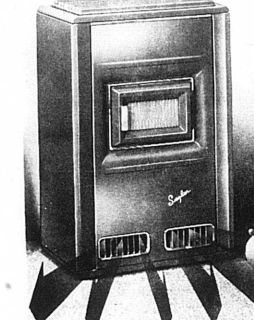

Farm Facts

Two Sides of the Picture—After working in agriculture for over a half century I am not at all dependent upon the farm for the major portion of my income. Thus I am both a producer and consumer of farm products and am caught in the dilemma between equitable farm prices and low living costs. Recently—and over the past years—I have seen the cost of living going up much faster than the farm income, and, at the same time, have heard the farmer's blamed unfairly for the rising cost of food.

The actual farm price of most very little—much less than it did when the consumer's bought large quantities such as potatoes, flour, sugar, and the like. Now, a large part of the grocer's margin will go to processing, packaging and distribution. If you will look up a typical grocery cart, you will see a large amount of paper goods, health aids, hard and soft drinks, many other non-food items. There are the additional costs of seed, fertilizers, and the like, some of which are around the world and the farmer's loss due to benefit to them.

A good example of the rising cost of food is the increase in illustrated by the case of the fryers, an item that sells for less today than it did forty years ago. A few weeks ago the difference between a pound of each and a pound of each was a cent or two. Today the difference is a cent or two to twelve cents per pound. This is a matter of a few cents, but amounts to from eighteen to thirty cents. This is much more than the farmer's labor income—often, a high cost enterprise.

It is the wish of the farmers' income has improved some during recent years due primarily because millions of small inefficient farmers have moved to town and the remaining have become better operators. Their better income is due more to improved technology and management than to their own efforts.
