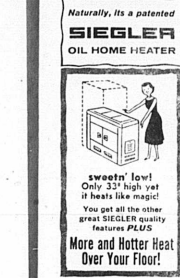

A high school press box Saturday night had another thought, "you can't win if you don't score", he said. Kentucky has not had the ability to score. The Wildcats have racked up less than five points a game in winning two and losing three times. Three times the Cats have failed to put a single point on the scoreboard, and like the man said, you can't win if you don't score". Kentucky was swamped Saturday night by LSU 30-0. That was only one point short of the total points the Wildcat defenders had given up in their three first games. The defensive team at UK has't done anything. The offense is just in more critical shape.

LSU's first score came on an 80 yard punt return. Remember though, the offensive team covers punts. It failed in this department a short time later when Sammy Green, who had made the 80-yard scoring dash, went 60 yards with another Kentucky punt to the 90-yard line. The defensive team came in and stopped LSU on the 12. The offensive team put the defense in the hole again when a snap from Scooter called over Larry Soper's head while he was back to punt. LSU got the ball on the Kentucky 28. The defense held again, with Jerry Davis intercepting a pass. The offense wasn't through parting the defensive team in the hole. LSU's Jerry Joseph intercepted a pass and returned it to the Kentucky 23. Again the defensive team held, but fourth down and eleven yards to go, Steve Daniel kicked a 42 yard field goal to put LSU ahead 10-0. The damage had been done. Kentucky's offense was so inept, LSU, in all its scoring, never once had to make a long march. The worst field position the Tigers had on a touchdown drive was midfield. The offense also turned the ball over to them on the two, and forty yard line. The man may be right, "you can't win if you don't score".

## Summary of changes in KENTUCKY'S COURT SYSTEM

**A UNIFIED COURT SYSTEM** The proposed Constitution Revision seeks to unify Kentucky's court system from the highest state level through the local level. The unified system would consist of a Supreme Court, a Court of Appeals, Circuit Courts and District Courts.  
**THE SUPREME COURT** This would be a new judicial level created out of the existing Court of Appeals, presently Kentucky's highest court. The Supreme Court would become the highest court—the court of last resort—in the Commonwealth. The Supreme Court would set rules of procedure for lower courts. Jurisdiction would be established by the General Assembly.  
**THE COURT OF APPEALS** A new intermediate judicial level, the Court of Appeals, would relieve some of the work load from the Supreme Court. It would consist of at least nine judges, one from each of the seven Court Districts and two from the state-at-large.  
**CIRCUIT COURTS** The Circuit Courts would operate as they do now.  
**DISTRICT COURTS** DISTRICT COURTS would be created for each county and would assume the present jurisdiction of the County, Justice of Peace, Quarterly and County Courts. The General Assembly would provide for as many District Court judges in each district as the Supreme Court certifies is necessary. Generally, there would be one district court for each county. However, two adjoining counties could be consolidated into one district if the Supreme Court certifies that one district judge could handle the judicial business of the combined counties. In this case, a District Court Commissioner would be named from residents of counties other than the one in which the judge lives.

**QUALIFICATION OF JUDGES** Under the Constitution Revision, all judges would be qualified attorneys.

**QUALIFICATION OF JUDGES** Under the Constitution Revision, all judges would be qualified attorneys.
