**Ward To Stage Rally At Cynthiana Friday**

One highlight in this primary election drive begins Friday night in Cynthiana when Henry Ward stages his first of six regional rallies. Nicholas County is one of 28 to be included for the April 14 meeting at Cynthiana city hall.  
The 7:30 p.m. event starts another phase in the former highway commissioner's bid for the Democratic nomination for governor as he will deliver major addresses concerning his platform at these regional gatherings.  
"Thus far we have experienced tremendous turnout wherever we have visited," Henry Ward said. "Now that we are less than two months away from the primary we are working just that much harder to guarantee a big win on May 23."  
State Assistant Chairman Foster Oberman will introduce Ward.  
State Senator Louisville, over 10,000 persons joined in a fundraising program at Freedom Hall as they finance Ward's efforts for the governorship.  
There, the former legislator listed nine specific areas of interest he said were of utmost importance to the people of Kentucky.  
He plans to elaborate on each between now and his primary election, Ward said.
