**AN ORDINANCE**  
Continued from Page 3  
Any such business will be charged \$1.00 per month for the use of the City dump.  
Section 6 - No trash shall be burned within the city limits, other than in an approved incinerator, and no garbage shall be mixed with trash.  
Section 7 - Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this ordinance shall be fined not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) and not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each offense, and each day of non-compliance shall constitute a separate offense.  
Section 8 - If any section, clause, provision or portion of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of the ordinance which is not in itself invalid or unconstitutional. Any ordinance of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky in conflict herewith is hereby specifically repealed to the extent of such conflict. This ordinance shall become effective after passage and publication as required by law.
