Excess Fertilizer No Guarantee Of Good Burley

Lexington -- It isn't a guarantee of a good burley crop to "put the fertilizer on," says Irvin M. Mable, U. K. Cooperative Extension Service agronomist.

"Large amounts of fertilizer do not necessarily improve either yield or quality. In fact, too much nitrogen can hurt the crop's production of smoking-quality tobacco. Too much phosphorus and potassium (phosphate and potash) may not hurt quality, but will be an unnecessary expense. And over-fertilizing tobacco may mean other farm crops are being absorbed necessary fertilizer," he says.

"If made a good soil test. If one properly, it will tell you what you need in fertilizer -- no more, no less.

"Watch your nitrogen applications carefully. Use records on past crop performance, fertilizer practices and cropping history to determine nitrogen needs. Too much nitrogen means a rough, thick, late-maturing tobacco with a heavy midrib. Too little may mean small leaves, slender stalks, premature "firing" (yellowing or browning of leaves at the bottom of the stalk and

HANKFORD, Ky. -- The changing winds of political fortune, plus the field of 10 hopefuls for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination, have shifted many faithful supporters of the Past to other camps, but Highway Commissioner Henry Ward seems to be the chief beneficiary.
