

Holiday Care With Fire Is Urged, Yuletide Fires Can Be Prevented

To keep the yuletide season a joyous one, care with fire during the Christmas and New Year holiday period was urged today by the American Insurance Association.

"Every day more than 1,000 American homes are struck by fire," said Dewey Dorsett, president of the Association, "which cause every fifth fire to claim a life."

"One of every four fires in our country is the result of carelessness," Mr. Dorsett added.

"If we use ordinary care, we can

hold down our tragic fire toll."

Fire losses in the United States this year will top one billion, Mr. Dorsett said. Fire deaths will exceed 11,000.

"Make sure every careless act near the Christmas tree, do not stand too near the tree with a lit cigarette. And replace or discard your immediately if it becomes dry."

"I am stressing fire safety during the holiday season because that is the time we most want to avoid fires so that all may have a joyous Christmas," Mr. Dorsett said.

"However, fire prevention is not just a holiday whim. Fire prevention is a year-round job, and after the holidays we should continue to work untiringly to keep our homes fire safe."

Be Sure Sitter Knows What To Do In Case Of Fire

If you expect to be out for an evening during the Christmas holiday season, be sure to employ a baby sitter who is responsible and also knows what to do in case of fire, says the American Insurance Association.
