### Historical Briefs Of Carlisle

First Presbyterian Church Established in Carlisle From 1810 to 1819 the following business were established in Carlisle and Nicholas County: a tannery mill, a woolen mill, a saw yard, a saddle mill, a shoe shop, a hatter, a baker, four blacksmiths, a tailor shop, and a billiard and pool hall.

There were also members of the Presbyterian minister, the first county clerk was Gen. Andrew S. Hughes.

Board Meeting Of Town Board Held June 5, 1816 There were five members on the board. In addition to other duties pertaining to the establishment of a county seat...

At the second meeting on June 14, 1816, the names of the original trustees were adopted. Of those north and south, beginning eastward, William, Second, Main, Cross, Elm and Sycamore; of those south and west beginning north: North, Mulberry, Main, Front, South and Water.

First School Walks On April 16, 1820 the trustees of Carlisle ordered that the owners of all lots on Main, Main Cross and Second Streets, lying on the public squares and the corners of Old Lane, 13-34, 47 and 61 be required on or before the first day of November, next to pave the footwalks in front of their property with either brick or stone, 11 feet wide, with a sufficient curb on the outside of the sidewalk.

First School and Religious Practices On Sunday, ladies and young gentlemen would walk to Old Concord, three miles from town, to hear preaching. The lady would take a "hack" which was a horse-drawn carriage, and after the afternoon service they would return to town.
