To give some faint idea of the amount of light thrown upon the earth's surface by the meteor shower of 1833, it was said that one could easily pick up a pin anywhere in the streets of Carlisle.

Carlisle Cemetery Organized in 1821

In 1821, a small boy pulled a coffee pot of boiling water over his head and face, causing his death in a few hours. So far no burial ground had been established in Carlisle. The father of the boy received permission from General

Metcalfe to bury the boy in the corner of his farm, just where the Millersburg and Forest Retreat roads diverged from the town limits. And thus we have the origin of the Carlisle Cemetery.

Charter Formed In 1845

CHARTER FORMED IN 1845 for a town-like form from Carlisle to Forest Retreat. It was finished in 1846.

First Railroad Passenger Ride into Town On October 25, 1871

First Mayor Was Charles W. Munger

In the year 1880 the village form abolished and the city form of government established. The city was divided into three wards, with six councilmen from each ward.

Few Kentuckians Realize That U.S. Highway 68 Dates Back To Prehistoric Days

Few Kentuckians traveling through Nicholas County on U.S. Highway 68 realize that this stretch of road dates back to prehistoric days.

Thousands of years ago, during the Pleistocene period, giant mammoths and mastodons were forced from their northern homes by the encroaching

ice age. In search of fresh pasturage and salt they moved across the Ohio River and into Central Kentucky, traveling a swath 20 to 60 feet wide and 25 miles long as they lumbered from one salt lick to the next.

The Mound Builders, ancient abori-

ginal men, were next to use the route. Mounds built by these people are still found scattered through Kentucky. At least seven of these prehistoric sites have been discovered in Nicholas County, most of them containing skeletons, beads, and artifacts.

Hundreds of years later herds of buffalo in search of salt took the line of least resistance along the same trail. Indians followed them and eventually came the pioneer. Many of Kentucky's early settlers came down the

Ohio River on flatboats and then used

the road to transport their belongings to future homesteads. Today, a part of U.S. 68, the road is an important part of that east-west arterial highway.
