Know Your Tax Forms
Q - Do I have to wait for my W-2 before sending in my return? I have a refund coming and want to file as soon as I can.
A - You must wait until you have your W-2 forms before filing your return. When IRS receives returns that do not have required W-2's attached, processing is held up until the taxpayer is contacted and the missing forms supplied.
Q - What state and local taxes are deductible on my federal tax return?
A - State and local income taxes, general sales taxes, state and local gasoline taxes, annual ad valorem personal property taxes, and real estate taxes levied for the general welfare are deductible. Deductions for local taxes on alcoholic beverages, tobacco and certain miscellaneous taxes. Also, the cost of auto tags are deductible only to the extent it is based on the value of your car.
Q - You will find further details on what is and is not deductible in the Form 1040 instruction booklet.
A - The publication, Your Federal Income Tax provides additional information on tax filing. It may be obtained for \$0.50 at any IRS office.
Q - Where should you file your return, in the district where you live or the district where you have your legal residence?
A - Tax returns should be filed in the district where you legally reside. For the majority of taxpayers legal residence and actual residence are identical.
Q - I was off the job for two months last year with a kidney infection. In the 580 a week I received in sick pay deductible?
A - If the \$80 a week you received was 75 percent

or less of your normal salary and you were hospitalized at least one day, you may exclude from gross income \$75 a week for the first 30 days of your absence and \$80 a week thereafter. If you were not hospitalized, nothing can be excluded under a 7-day waiting period, beginning with the first day of work you missed. Then you may exclude \$7 a week for 73 days, and the full \$80 thereafter. However, if the \$80 a week you receive was more than 75 percent of your normal salary then the waiting period is 30 days from the first day of absence from work, and nothing may be excluded until that period is up. This will be true whether or not you are hospitalized.
The maximum amount excludable after the first 30 days is \$100 per week.
Q - Is it true that you don't have to provide over half a person's support to be able to claim him as a dependent? I've heard that if several people chip in to support someone then it was up to the group doing the supporting to decide who should claim the dependency exemption. Is that right?
A - Under some circumstances that is correct. Cases like this usually arise when several members of a family contribute jointly to the support of another member. When the other tests for claiming a dependent are met, and when several people together have provided more than half the support of a person, but no one person has contributed more than half, they may agree to permit one of them to claim the exemption.
To do this, the person who takes the exemption must have contributed over 10 percent of the support and the other who contributed over 10 percent must sign a declaration that they will not claim the exemption for that year. These declarations must be filed with the return of the one claiming the exemption.

Egyptians Like U.S. Cigarette Tobacco Best
Lexington - Egyptian smokers think cigarettes made with American

tobaccoes have the right taste and flavor.
And, Egyptians have a strong preference for such cigarettes, say Dr. D.A. Livermore, Virginia Polytechnic Institute, Blacksburg, Va., and Aubrey J. Brown, University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service economist in Cairo.
"The traditional water pipe for smoking is losing ground in Egypt, and there is a trend away from cigarettes made entirely of oriental tobaccos," the researchers said. "Blends with a high proportion of American tobaccos are preferred for mildness and quality."
Few Egyptian women smoke. Such a practice is frowned on in Egypt. The percentage of women who probably about 5 percent of the population. But this may be changing, Dr. Hamamby says.
"Men, as heads of households, answered the survey team's questions on smoking. This, reports on number of women smokers here may have been kept low on purpose."
The most popular cigarette brand in Egypt today is "Belmont," a filter-tip made in Cairo. It has about 50 percent American tobacco. It sales have grown from 3 billion

Egyptian tobacco market. No tobacco is produced in Egypt. A major part of imports of U.S. tobacco is paid for with local Egyptian currency under provisions of Public Law 480 funds.
Egyptian farmers and other rural residents will go in for roll-your-own tobaccos. These usually are oriental blends, but even here at least one manufacturer in El Fayum province is introducing an American blend. Dr. Hamamby's research was supported by a contract with three American tobacco-grower export associations, The Tobacco Associates, Florida and Dark Leaf Tobacco Exports Association, and Leaf Tobacco Exporter's Association. Also cooperating were the Virginia Tech Extension Division, and the University of Kentucky Agricultural Experiment Station.
