Black Walnut Seedlings Available for Planting

Frankfort — The State Department of Natural Resources and the Kentucky Farm Bureau are trying to get farmers and growers to plant walnut tree seedlings this spring.

County farm bureaus are taking orders for seedlings from the nurseries of the Department's Division of Forestry, Civic groups, youth organizations and home-maker clubs are being asked to promote the idea.

Landowners are missing a good bet if they don't put some shade, idle land and land along fence rows and creeks to producing walnut trees, said John W. Koon, executive secretary of the farm bureau.

"It takes between 40 and 50 years for them to reach a good size but they increase the value of the land while growing," he said. "I can't imagine a cheaper investment that will pay bigger dividends."

Natural Resources Commissioner J. O. Matlock said "now is the time to get the orders." He said seedlings will be packaged in bundles of 250 each and sent to county farm bureau headquarters in March. The county farm bureaus will break the bundles down into smaller lots, according to the sizes of orders they have. He said the division of forestry will sell the trees for \$8 per 1,000. More than a million walnut seedlings will be available this spring, he said.
