Know Your Teacher

Mrs. Bertha Barnes, Supervisor - science teacher, is a native of Estill County, Kentucky. She attended public school at Irvine and graduated from Irvine High School.

She holds a B.S. Degree from Eastern State University, graduating with high distinction. She has a Master's Degree from Eastern State University, and is currently a Doctorate Degree at the University of Kentucky.

She is a licensed Kentucky teacher, a graduate of the National Tax Training School, and a Kentucky School. The total is about \$100 million.

She is second with \$48 million. Among the others are: gasoline and oil, \$32 million; cigarettes, \$23 million; liquor, \$23 million; beer, \$21 million; and soft drinks, \$19 million.

In general, it is shown, there is a close relationship between a community's buying potential and the amount of advertising used in connection with it. On the average, about 3.7 cents is spent in advertising for every \$1 of retail business.

Applying this national average to Nicholas County and its retail sales volume of \$4,875,000, the indicated advertising expenditure would be \$182,000.

In areas where the buying potential is not great as it is locally, the amount spent on advertising is correspondingly less.

Asked how important he thought advertising was to the economy, Luther H. Hodges, former Secretary of Commerce, said, "It is vital. Without it our national income would shrink, production would drop and many jobs would disappear."
