

Income Tax Questions

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

Q - When will I get my tax forms in the mail?
A - Distribution of the 1966 tax forms should be completed early in January.

Q - Forms will also be available at IRS offices as well as many banks and post offices.
A - A Social Security pension taxable.

Q - No it is not.
A - I worked last summer to earn money for college but made less than \$600. How can I get back what was withheld from my pay for income tax?

Q - File an income tax return to obtain a refund of any income tax which was withheld from your wages. The card Form 1040, may be used, as well as the easiest, for you to use. Don't forget to put your Social Security number on the return and attach your W-2 Form. The W-2 shows how much was withheld.

Q - Has there been any change in the income tax rates for 1967?
A - No. An individual's income for 1966 is taxed at the same rates in effect for the preceding year.

Q - When can I expect to get my W-2 from my employer?
A - Employers are required to issue Form W-2 by the end of January but may not so earlier.

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A - These figures are provided as a convenience for those taxpayers who deduct state gasoline tax when they itemize deductions. If you are entitled to claim this deduction then you may use the table included in doing the calculation yourself.

Q - If my wife and I file separately, instead of jointly, can one itemize while the other uses the standard deduction?
A - No. Married couples filing separate returns must handle their expenses the same way. If one itemizes the other must, too.

Q - Married couples filing separately must also take the same type of standard deduction. If one takes the minimum standard deduction they both must take it.
