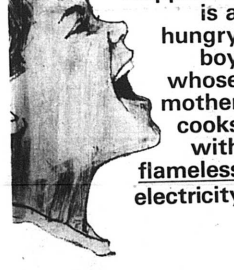

**"DIRECTORY LISTINGS" ENTICE BUSINESS-PROFESSIONAL PEOPLE**  
At this season of the year many professional and businessmen are receiving requests to permit listing of their personal or firm names in classified business directories.  
Those who sell space in some of these directories, allegedly published on a nation-wide scale, have several things going for them.  
First, the prospect usually is flattered at the idea of being selected for a national listing.  
Secondly, the solicitation form usually resembles an invoice for a contract already agreed upon.  
And third, there is little chance that the advertiser ever will learn whether the directory actually was published, or, if it was, the number and quality of its circulation.  
If money and value are no object, sign up without a second thought.

**County Agent**

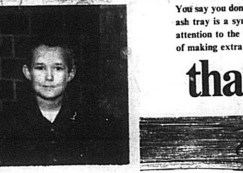
The county agent as Kentucky has known him is not disappearing. But in the future the agent's office will involve all the professionals and work with teachers, as various area specialists from the University of Kentucky and regional problem, delegates to the Kentucky Cooperative Conference were told in Lexington last week.  
Dr. Lewis W. Cochran, UK provost and dean of the Graduate School, said the University already has area specialists and extension professors at work, "who have a higher degree of specialization and more formal education in particular specialty."  
They serve not a single county, but a group of counties, he said.  
At the same time, Cochran said, there will be an enlargement of this service function of the University.  
"There is a changing pattern in cooperative extension service in agriculture, which now requires a greater degree of expertise on the part of extension people than ever before," he said. "In our county agent and home demonstration agent positions."

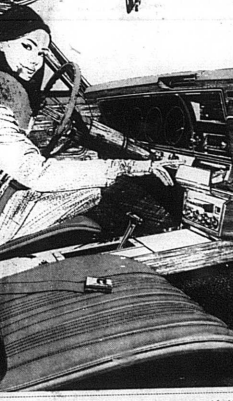
