

Ward To Aid Small Business

Louisville, Ky.—An effort to help Kentucky small businesses expand would be started under an administration with Henry Ward as governor, the Democratic candidate said here Saturday.

Appearing in Louisville before members of the Kentucky Press Association, Ward said expansion of efforts currently being made by the Kentucky Commerce Department for middle-management groups would not burden the taxpayer.

"In fact," he stressed, "common sense tells us

that its accomplishments will stimulate growth and development, thus making this division one of necessity."

The former Highway Commissioner recalled his work with the Louisville Chamber of Commerce, and how he had worked with small businesses in seeking solutions to their varied problems.

War On Delinquency

FRANKFORT —Governor Edward T. Breathitt has outlined a six-year plan to combat juvenile delinquency.

The State blueprint includes construction of 21 new buildings and renovation of four existing buildings by 1972 to accommodate 1,337 children at one time.

Three of the projects will be under way by the end of Breathitt's term. Daniel Boone Boys Camp in Boone County, for which a contract has been awarded, Juvenile Manor Treatment Center for Girls in Jefferson County, contract awarded, and the Northern Kentucky Regional Diagnostic and Detention Center for which a site is to be chosen.

During 1968-72, these projects will be built: Regional centers in Louisville, western Kentucky, southeastern Kentucky and eastern Kentucky; eight more youth forestry camps; four halfway houses near the regional centers, and two residential treatment centers for girls.

To be renovated are: Kentucky Reception Center at Louisville, which will be converted into a treatment center for hyper-aggressive boys; Kentucky Village at Greendale; and the Children's Home at Lyndon, to treat emotionally disturbed children between 8 and 15. The Barkley Boys Camp near Gilbertsville will be replaced.

Breathitt says the program is the result of a study by the Department of Child Welfare. Present institutions, designed to accommodate 250, are housing an average of 300.

For dependent children the State is concentrating on a home-care program.

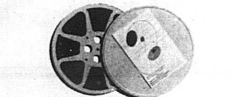

the 1040 instructions you will find an explanation of whether your quality for these rates. Instead of household tax rates cannot be used if you are married and can file a joint return.

Q - I won a prize in the contest run by the local filling station. It was cash. Do I have to report it as income?

A - Yes you do. Prizes such as yours as well as money or merchandise won in lucky number drawings, radio and television quizzes or from any sales promotion program are taxable and must be declared as income.

Q - My name was misspelled on the 1040 package I received in the mail. How can I correct this?

A - Make the change on the 1040 you received by marking through the error and entering your correct name. It is helpful for us to get the corrected label back to aid in identifying the error and making the necessary changes. If your Social Security number is misspelled please correct it in the same manner.

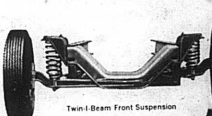
Q - Are child support payments deductible?

A - Child support payments are not deductible to you nor are they taxable to your former wife. However, if you, rather than your former wife, provide more than one-half the child's support, then you may claim the \$600 dependency exemption on your return.

Q - I changed jobs last year and now find myself driving about 30 miles a day to get back and forth to work. Can I deduct 10¢ a mile for this driving?

A - No. Commuting to and from work is a personal expense and is not deductible.
