Billy Ray Jones
Cynthiana man died early Saturday after a stroke at age 62 about three miles east of Georgetown and crashed into a tree.

Billy Ray Jones, 23, of the John Graves Ford Memorial Hospital, about an hour after the accident. Deputy coroner Kenneth Grant listed the cause of death as internal hemorrhage.

State Trooper James Vest said ice on the road apparently caused Jones to lose control of his car which traveled 186 feet along a ditch before crashing into a tree. Jones was alone in the car.

Jones was a native of Bourbon County and an employee of Kawneer Co., Cynthiana.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Verma Darlene Jones, and three children, Donald Gene, Gladys Kay and Cherry Lane Jones, at home.
