Spraying Recommended

After Alfalfa Harvest

Lexington, Ky. -- After you've cut your alfalfa crop, get the hay off the ground as soon as possible to expose the soil to a lot of sunlight. This will kill a lot of weevils, says Dr. Rudy Schreiber, U.K. Cooperative Extension Service Entomologist, and make control problems somewhat easier.

Spray the stubble with a long-lasting insecticide, he recommends, to further cut the weevil problem. Use one of the following -- Cubane, Alfox or Farnathion.

Check with area extension offices in the county for spray mixing, application and safety precautions. He says, "It points out that U.K. recommends application of Paris Green and Cubane, very toxic materials, by trained operators. All materials should be handled very carefully, though, he emphasizes.

"From all indications, the weevils should be leaving the fields soon and should not be a problem in the second cutting, which it might do, carry out your control program as recommended by U.K., Dr. Schreiber said. "If the weevils do cause any damage on the valuable first cutting, it was described as heavy this season."

FORAGE FIELDS NEED TOP DRESSING.

UK SOIL SPECIALISTS SAY

Lexington -- Top dressings and topsoil should be applied as soon as first harvest is made, provided these fields were fertilized the last year.
