Vacation Costs Up, Car Owners To Spend \$3,882,000 In County

(Special to the Mercury) NEW YORK - With the vacation season at hand and with many Nicholas County families planning automobile jaunts to various parts of the country, the question of cost becomes a prime consideration.

According to the American Automobile Association, which surveys the situation every two years, practically everything has gone up in price. The net effect, for two people trav-

eling by car this summer, is that they will have to spend about \$3 a day more for necessities than they did in 1965.

On the basis of the AAA findings, Nicholas County residents must figure on a budget of \$30 per day to provide the essentials for two persons.

Also included is a letter from the Nicholas County Farm Bureau expressing their interest in making facilities available for new industry.
