4-Lane Highway Pledged By Ward Between Paris And Lexington

Four-laning of the U.S. 27 - U.S. 68 route between Paris and Lexington was committed in a statement Wednesday by Henry Ward, Democratic candidate for governor.
"I ordered preliminary engineering of this project while I was commissioner of highways, and will carry out this work as Governor," Ward said.
"It will cost an estimated \$2,004,000 to build the 6.8 mile section of U.S. 27-68 bypass in Bourbon County for the 5.7 miles in Fayette County. These projects can be financed under the state road building program during my administration as Governor."
